THE THREAT OF CYBER WAR IS REAL ACCORDING TO MAJORITY OF SOLD-OUT AUDIENCE AT FIRST-EVER WASHINGTON, DC INTELLIGENCE SQUARED U.S. DEBATE

71 Percent Reject the Motion "The Cyber War Threat Has Been Grossly Exaggerated"

WASHINGTON, DC – June 10, 2010 –Intelligence Squared U.S. (IQ2US), the Oxford-style debate series, an initiative of The Rosenkranz Foundation, presented its first-ever debate outside of its New York City home base. On Tuesday evening, a standing-room-only crowd at Washington, DC's Newseum heard four of the country's leading cyber experts discuss key issues related to the threats and challenges of the nation's cyber security as they debated the motion "*The Cyber War Threat Has Been Grossly Exaggerated*."

The team arguing against the motion carried the day. Prior to the debate, 24% of the audience was in favor of the motion, 54% were against it and 22% were undecided. At the debate's conclusion, the audience voted again and this time 23% supported the motion, 71% rejected it and only 6% remained undecided.

The evening's winning team included Vice Admiral (ret.) **Mike McConnell**, Director of the NSA 1992-96; Director of National Intelligence 2007-2009; currently senior VP at Booz Allen Hamilton and **Jonathan Zittrain**, Professor of Law at Harvard Law School; co-founder and faculty co-director, Berkman Center for Internet & Society.

Marc Rotenberg, Exec Director of the Electronic Privacy Information Center (EPIC) and Adjunct Professor at Georgetown University Law Center and **Bruce Schneier**, internationally renowned security technologist and author and Chief Security Technology Officer of BT argued for the motion.

The debate was produced with underwriting support from Neustar, Inc. WAMU 88.5, the leading public radio station for NPR news and information in the greater Washington, D.C., area, worked with IQ2US and will broadcast the debate, along with the 220 NPR stations that regularly carry the series. Intelligence Squared U.S. debates are also broadcast internationally by the Bloomberg Television network.

John Donvan, correspondent for ABC News *Nightline*, is moderator of IQ2US debates. Dana Wolfe is the executive producer.
